

SUBLOCADE® (buprenorphine extended-release) ADDITIONAL SITE OF CARE (ASOC) PATHWAY

What is an ASOC administering practitioner?

An Additional Site of Care (ASOC) is a facility or healthcare provider (HCP), other than a prescribing physician's office, that may provide a flexible option for the administration of SUBLOCADE injections. An ASOC administering practitioner (AP) is a Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)-registered practitioner who is authorized to conduct the administration of controlled substances under local, state, and federal regulations.



STEPS FOR USING AN ASOC

Prescribing Healthcare Professional

STEP 1: Locate an AP

A prescribing HCP identifies a eligible AP to administer SUBLOCADE.

STEP 2: Prescribe SUBLOCADE

Depending on preference of AP, complete an enrollment form for the chosen REMS-certified pharmacy or send a valid prescription and indicate the AP for SUBLOCADE delivery; the AP may require an order to inject.

STEP 3: Coordinate Care

The patient care remains with the prescribing HCP to continue the determined addiction treatment modality.

ASOC Administering Practitioner

STEP 1: Determine Preferred Procurement Method

An AP may use product procured from a REMS-certified pharmacy or a network specialty distributor.

STEP 2: Determine Coverage

If using a pharmacy, the pharmacy will determine coverage for the patient. If a prior authorization is required, the pharmacy will notify the prescribing HCP. The pharmacy will contact the patient to collect the out-of-pocket costs.

If using a specialty distributor, the AP conducts a benefit investigation to determine coverage. If a prior authorization is required, the AP will notify the prescribing HCP. The AP contacts the patient to collect the out-of-pocket costs.

WARNING: RISK OF SERIOUS HARM OR DEATH WITH INTRAVENOUS ADMINISTRATION; SUBLOCADE RISK EVALUATION AND MITIGATION STRATEGY

- Serious harm or death could result if administered intravenously. SUBLOCADE forms a solid mass upon contact with body fluids and may cause occlusion, local tissue damage, and thrombo-embolic events, including life threatening pulmonary emboli, if administered intravenously.
- Because of the risk of serious harm or death that could result from intravenous self-administration, SUBLOCADE is only
 available through a restricted program called the SUBLOCADE REMS Program. Healthcare settings and pharmacies that
 order and dispense SUBLOCADE must be certified in this program and comply with the REMS requirements.



STEPS FOR USING AN ASOC (cont.)



Contact a Patient Access Specialist (PAS) to assist at any step in the process. To find your PAS, visit **www.INSUPPORT.com**.

STEP 4: Refill Prescription

If using a pharmacy, the pharmacy will refill SUBLOCADE when appropriate and contact the prescribing HCP and the patient to coordinate the next shipment with the AP.

Alternatively, the AP may contact the patient directly to schedule the subsequent injections based on orders from the prescribing HCP.

How INSUPPORT® Can Help

INSUPPORT® can conduct a benefit investigation to determine if using a specialty pharmacy is an option for the patient and which specialty pharmacy may be required by their plan.

INSUPPORT can enroll an eligible patient into the Copay Assistance Program* for SUBLOCADE, if requested. There are two ways to enroll: the INSUPPORT Patient Enrollment Form or at **www.INSUPPORT.com/savings**.

*The INSUPPORT Copay Assistance Program is valid only for patients with private insurance who are prescribed SUBLOCADE for on-label use. Patients with government insurance are not eligible for the Copay Assistance Program, including, but not limited to, Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, VA, DoD, TRICARE, CHAMPVA, or any other federally or state-funded government-assisted program. STEP 3: Administer SUBLOCADE

If using a pharmacy, once SUBLOCADE is approved for the patient, the pharmacy will coordinate the shipment in conjunction with the patient's appointment.

If AP is purchasing direct from a network specialty distributor, the product is administered from on-hand quantity.

On the day of the appointment, the AP can refer to the full Prescribing Information, including Instructions for Use to administer SUBLOCADE to the patient.

INSUPPORT can provide product-specific billing and coding information.
